Ring 1, Entry £5, Prizes: Trophy for 1st place, Rosettes for 1st-6th place, 9.00am***

Class 1 SHETLAND PONY. Stallion, Mare or Gelding. Class to be split if numbers justify

Class 2 MOUNTAIN and MOORLAND, any age, to be shown in hand. Class to be split if numbers permit - large and small. Shetland Ponies not eligible.

Class 3 RIDING PONY. Youngstock, Colt, Filly or Gelding, 3 years and under, not to exceed 14.2h.h at maturity

Class 4 ARAB, Pure Bred/Part Bred, any age and any height

Class 5 HUNTER YOUNG STOCK IN HAND, Colt, Filly or Gelding, 3 years and under to exceed 15 hands at maturity

Special: A rosette will be offered to the best 2 year old in Class 6

Championship for 1st and 2nd Prize winners in Classes 3 and 4

Ring 2, Entry £5, 9.00am

Class 6 BEST TURNED OUT LEAD REIN PONY, Mare or Gelding, 4 years old and over not exceeding 12h.h. Riders not to have attained their 7th birthday before 1 January in the current year.

Class 7 LEAD REIN PONY, Mare or Gelding, 4 years old and over not exceeding 12h.h. Riders not to have attained their 7th birthday before 1st January in the current year.

Class 8 SHOW HUNTER PONY, Mare or Gelding, 4 years old and over not exceeding 14.3h.h.

Class 9 FAMILY PONY, Mare or Gelding, 4 years old and over not exceeding 14.2.h.h. Judged on manners and suitability for all the family. A small jump may be included at the discretion of the judge. Snaffle bits only.

Class 10 VETERAN PONY (14.2 h.h and under) open to any pony 16 years or over. To be shown under saddle.

Class 11 RIDDEN PONY (14.2 h.h and under). To be shown under saddle.

Class 12 COLOURED (Ridden) - 14.2h.h and under.

MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND RIDDEN

Ring 1, Entry £5, 11.00am

Class 13 BEST TURNED OUT, large and small breeds

Class 14 LEAD REIN, Mountain and Moorland not exceeding 12.2h.h. Ponies must be 4 years old and over. Riders not to have attained their 9th birthday before 1st January in the current year

Class 15 RIDDEN MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND, small and large breeds. Class may be split if sufficient entries.

Class 16 YOUNG HANDLERS MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND, ponies 4 years old and over not exceeding 13.2h.h. To be shown by a child over 7 years of age and under 12 years of age.

COMPETITORS TO NOTE: In the Mountain and Moorland turnout the judge will be looking at the overall impressions of horse and rider, i.e. a proper Mountain and Moorland presentation with animals shown in their natural state.

This is not a tack inspection and no points will be awarded. As ever the judge's decision is final. Championship for Classes 13-16, Rosette for reserve Champion

HUNTERS AND RIDING HORSES SECTION

Ring 2, Entry £5, Prizes: Trophy for 1st place, Rosettes for 1st-6th place

Class 17 VETERAN HORSE exceeding 14.2h.h - 16 years or over to be shown under saddle.

Class 18 FAMILY HORSE, 4 year old and over exceeding 14.2h.h. The judge will be looking for well mannered sensible horses. A small jump may be included at the discretion of the judge. Horses competing in this class are not eligible for classes 19, 20, 21 snaffle bits only.

Class 19 RIDING HORSE, 4 years old and over, exceeding 14.2h.h.

Class 20 SMALL SHOW HUNTER, 4 years old and over, exceeding 14.2h.h. but not exceeding 16h.h.

Class 21 LARGE SHOW HUNTER, 4 years old and over exceeding 16h.h.

Class 22 RIDDEN ARAB, 4 years old and over

CHAMPIONSHIP for 1st and 2nd Prize winners in Classes 17-21.

CHAMPIONSHIP for class 4+22 Pure Bred Arab Stallions, Mares & Geldings kindly donated by Ms S. Bainbridge & Mr J Craig Sarim Stud, Crosshouse, Ayrshire.

OVERALL CHAMPION - All champions ie champ of each section to come forward for overall champion.

UNAFFILIATED SHOWJUMPING

All horse/ponies must have their passports available for inspection

Start Time 9.30am

Class 1 CLEAR ROUND - Height approx 65cm

This class will run until 11.00am

Entry Fee £3

Class 2 70cm OPEN - Open to both juniors and seniors

Entry fee £5

Class 3 80cm OPEN - Open to both juniors and seniors

Entry fee £5.

Class 4 90cm OPEN - Open to both juniors and seniors

Entry fee £5.

Class 5 SPEED CLASS - Height approx 80cm. Class will consist of 1 round judged on faults and time.

Entry fee £5.

Juniors must be 16 years or under

Seniors must be 17 years or over

(Irrespective of height of pony/horse)

Awards will be given to the first four juniors and the first four seniors in each class.

Points will be given for each placing:

First place 4 points

Second Place 3 points

Third Place 2 points

Fourth Place 1 point

The Junior and the senior with the most points at the end of the show will each receive a trophy.

PARKING OF FLOATS

The directors would respectfully draw exhibitors to the necessity of removing floats to the parking ground immediately animals have been set down.

CATALOGUE OF STOCK(All cattle from Brucellosis Accredited herds)

Entries are received subject to any orders already made or which may not yet be made by the Department of Agricultural and Fisheries.

PRIZE LIST

Competitors are requested to note that the ownership of all cups, shield or other trophies unless won outright by a competitor in accordance with the rules of the society, rests with the society, and that holders of such cups, shields or trophies are responsible to the society for the safe custody and protection. The society further reserves the right to alter rules and conditions relating to particular cups, shields and trophies from time to time, as the society may consider necessary.

POINTS AWARDED FOR TROPHIES

1st - 4points 2nd - 3points 3rd - 2points 4th - 1point

Any animal which has already won a trophy may compete again for the same trophy and in the event of the trophy awarded to it, the owner of the animal will have his name inscribed on the trophy, but this will not be qualification towards winning the trophy outright.

RULES

1. Exhibits will be received in the tent on Showfield from 8.00am to 10.00am on show day. All exhibits must be placed on their respective numbers by 10.00am and remain there until 3.30pm but should be removed by 5.00pm by the owner or one representative.
2. Judging will commence at 10.00am. The judges decision is final.
3. The society will not be liable for loss or damage from accident or otherwise. Every precaution will be taken however to protect all exhibits.
4. The show will be opened to the public after the completion of the judging - approx from 12 noon - 3.30pm
5. In computing points gained for the special points prizes offered 1st - 4points 2nd - 3points 3rd - 2points 4th - 1point.
6. Points in the event of a tie for cups, competitors gaining most 1st prizes would qualify for the cup or trophy

SHOW DAY REGULATIONS

1. Competition shall be restricted to members except where stated, but all competitors must pay the appropriate entry money
2. The ages of animals shall be calculated 1 January except where stated
3. Cattle and horses must be on the show ground, and exhibits in the Industrial Section in the showroom or hall at half an hour prior to judging commencing as the judges shall start promptly at the time stated
4. All the cattle doctored will be liable to disqualification. The veterinary inspector and committee reserve the right to examine cattle 3 days after the show. The decision of the veterinary inspector and committee shall be final
5. Cattle and horses must remain on the show ground until after the parade, and exhibits in the industrial section in the tent until 3.30pm
6. Only one person shall be admitted with animal or lot
7. Entries will be accepted on the Showfield
8. Should the number of exhibits entered in any class only equal or be less than the numbered of prizes offered for competition, the directors may retain the first and any other prizes.
9. In the event of any misdemeanour or breach of the show day regulations, the directors reserve the right to take such action they deem appropriate
10. Any complaints must be lodged with the secretary in writing before the grand parade
11. The decision of the directors on all matters adjudicated upon by them shall be final
12. Classes, entry money and prizes may be altered by the directors at their discretion without notice
13. All prizes winning animals must attend the parade
