



Ring 1

Section 1: Light Horses In Hand

To start at 9.00am sharp. Entry is £5 with £2 medical and rosettes for 1st-6th place.

All passports must be available for inspection.

Stallions and colts must be handled by an adult.

SECTION 1

Class 1: Shetland Pony- Stallion, mare or gelding in hand.

Class 2: Shetland Pony- Ridden and lead rein.

Championship for classes 1&2.

Shetland Ponies not eligible 3-6.

Class 3: Mountain and Moorland in Hand

Class 4: Mountain and Moorland Tack and Turnout

Class 5: Mountain and Moorland Lead Rein

Class 6: Mountain and Moorland Ridden. This class may be split large and small if numbers permit.

Championship for class 3-6

Andrew Wallace Trophy for best Shetland stallion

Glenmyvot Trophy for best shetland mare or gelding donated by Mrs D. Beattie.

Parklea Trophy for best lead rein/ridden in classes 2, 4, 5 and 6 donated by Mrs D. Beattie.

There will be a short lunch break after the completion of championship for classes 1-6.



Section 2

Class 7: Young Handlers. Handler 16 years and under. Pony to be 14.2h.h and under.

Class 8: Riding Pony Young Stock in Hand. To be 3 years old and under.

Class 9: Hunter Young Stock in Hand. To be 3 years old and under.

Class 10: Tack and Turnout. To be 14.2h.h and under.

Class 11: Riding Club Pony. To be 14.2h.h and under. There may be a small jump and snaffle bits only.

Class 12: Family Pony. To be judged on manners and suitability for the family. Snaffle bits only.

Class 13: Novice Ridden Pony. To be ridden in a snaffle bridle.

Class 14: Ridden pony. To be 14.2h.h and under.

Class 15: Show Hunter Pony. To be 14.2h.h and under.

Classes 14 and 15 are exempt from class 12.

Championship for classes 7-15





Ring 2 - Starting approx 9.00.

Class 16: Pure Bred Arab In Hand.

Class 17: Part Bred Arab In Hand

Class 18: Pure Bred Arab Ridden

Class 19: Part Bred Arab Ridden

Championship for classes 16-19 for the Earnbrig Trophy.

Class 20: Tack and Turnout. To be 15.h.h and over.

Class 21: Veteran Horse/Pony. Horse to be 16 years old and over. Benbolt Trophy for highest placed veteran. Split championship for horses and ponies.

Class 22: Riding club Horse. To be 15.h.h and over. A small jump may be included and snaffle bits only.

Class 23: Family Horse. 15.h.h and over. Snaffle bits only.

Class 24: Coloured Horse/Pony. Split championship for horses and ponies.

Class 25. Race horse to riding horse. Must be registered with ROR.

Championship for classes 20-25.

There will be a short lunch break for judge.

Starting approx 1.00. Classes 27, 28, 29 are exempt from class 23.

Class 26. Novice Ridden Horse. Snaffle bridles only.

Class 27: Small Show Hunter. Exceeding 14.2h.h but not exceeding 15.2h.h.

Class 28: Large Show Hunter. Exceeding 15.2h.h.

Class 29: Riding Horse. Exceeding 14.2h.h.

Championship for classes 26-29.





Ring 3

Section 3: Working Hunter

Starting approx. 9.00am

There will be clear round running from 9.00-11.00. Jumps can be put up or down to any height. £3.00 entry.

Class 30: Novice Working Hunter Pony. Ponies under 15h.h. Jumps approx 50cm.

Class 31: Open Working Hunter Pony. Ponies under 15h.h. Jumps approx 60cm.

Class 32: Novice Working Hunter Horse. Horses 15h.h and over. Jumps approx 70cm. Open to horses that have never won 1st place in an open class.

Class 33: Intermediate Working Hunter Horse. Horses 15h.h and over. Jumps approx 80cm.

Class 34: Open Working Hunter Horse. Horses 15h.h and over. Jumps approx 1m.

Class 35: Mountain and Moorland Working Hunter. Rider any age. Class may be split large and small if numbers permit. Jumps approx 65cm.

Championship for classes 30-35.

There will be a Supreme Championship for all Champions and Reserve Champions from all Sections.



UNAFFILIATED SHOWJUMPING

All horse/ponies must have their passports available for inspection

Start Time 9.30am

- Class 1 CLEAR ROUND - Crosspoles to start then height will increase, so come early if you want to jump the lower heights. This class will run until 11.00am - Entry fee £3
- Class 2 65cm - Open to both juniors and seniors - Entry fee £5
- Class 3 75cm - Open to both juniors and seniors - Entry fee £5
- Class 4 85cm - Open to both juniors and seniors - Entry fee £5
- Class 5 SPEED CLASS - Height approx 75cm
Class will consist of one round judged on faults and time.
Entry fee £5

Juniors must be 16 years or under - Seniors must be 17 years or over
(Irrespective of height of pony/horse)

Awards will be given to the first 6 juniors and the first 6 seniors in each class.

Points will be given for each placing:

- 1st - 6 points
- 2nd - 5 points
- 3rd - 4 points
- 4th - 3 points
- 5th - 2 points
- 6th - 1 point

The junior and the senior with the most points at the end of the show will each receive a trophy.

THESE WINNERS MUST BE PRESENT AT THE END OF THE SHOW.





PARKING OF FLOATS

Entries are received subject to any orders already made or which may not yet be made by the Department of Agricultural and Fisheries.

PRIZE LIST

Competitors are requested to note that the ownership of all cups, shield or other trophies unless won outright by a competitor in accordance with the rules of the society, rests with the society, and that holders of such cups, shields or trophies are responsible to the society for the safe custody and protection. The society further reserves the right to alter rules and conditions relating to particular cups, shields and trophies from time to time, as the society may consider necessary.

POINTS AWARDED FOR TROPHIES

1st - 4points 2nd - 3points 3rd - 2points 4th - 1point

Any animal which has already won a trophy may compete again for the same trophy and in the event of the trophy awarded to it, the owner of the animal will have his name inscribed on the trophy, but this will not be qualification towards winning the trophy outright.

RULES

1. Exhibits will be received in the tent on Showfield from 8.00am to 10.00am on show day. All exhibits must be placed on their respective numbers by 10.00am and remain there until 3.30pm but should be removed by 5.00pm by the owner or one representative.
2. Judging will commence at 10.00am. The judges decision is final.
3. The society will not be liable for loss or damage from accident or otherwise. Every precaution will be taken however to protect all exhibits.
4. The show will be opened to the public after 10am
5. In computing points gained for the special points prizes offered 1st - 4points 2nd - 3points 3rd - 2points 4th - 1point.
6. Points in the event of a tie for cups, competitors gaining most 1st prizes would qualify for the cup or trophy

SHOW DAY REGULATIONS

1. Competition shall be restricted to members except where stated, but all competitors must pay the appropriate entry money
2. The ages of animals shall be calculated 1 January except where stated
3. Cattle and horses must be on the show ground, and exhibits in the Industrial Section in the showroom or hall at half an hour prior to judging commencing as the judges shall start promptly at the time stated
4. All the cattle doctored will be liable to disqualification. The veterinary inspector and committee reserve the right to examine cattle 3 days after the show. The decision of the veterinary inspector and committee shall be final
5. Cattle and horses must remain on the show ground until after the parade, and exhibits in the industrial section in the tent until 3.30pm
6. Only one person shall be admitted with animal or lot
7. Entries will be accepted on the Showfield
8. Should the number of exhibits entered in any class only equal or be less than the numbered of prizes offered for competition, the directors may retain the first and any other prizes.
9. In the event of any misdemeanour or breach of the show day regulations, the directors reserve the right to take such action they deem appropriate
10. Any complaints must be lodged with the secretary in writing before the grand parade
11. The decision of the directors on all matters adjudicated upon by them shall be final
12. Classes, entry money and prizes may be altered by the directors at their discretion without notice
13. All prizes winning animals must attend the parade
